The yellow plant looks like a nitrogen deficient plant, which we suspected before looking at the nodules, but it is not nitrogen deficiency. Plant at the left was planted on May 10, and the one at the right on May 22. Picture was taken on July 17.



Figure 2. Closer look at the nodule size and number. Root from the yellow plant (larger nodules) is on the left and from green plant (smaller nodules) to the right of the picture to the left. When cut, nodules from both plants were dark green, which indicates active nitrogen fixation (small picture below).
